The Yamhill City Council meeting on March 11, 2026, included an award letter from FEMA for a \$3.14 million grant for a new 2.1-million-gallon water storage tank. Chief Graven reported on the potential return of animal control services through the county sheriff's office. The city administrator discussed ongoing projects, including the completion of the north Olive water project. The council also considered using the Department of Revenue to collect transient lodging taxes.

A) Administration

Interim City Administrator, Mayor Corrigan, read the correspondence received from Councilor Featherston giving accolades regarding the FEMA grant and the Police Chief's double-duty covering shifts and training the new reserve officer.
